Guidelines for Ethical Conduct

October 31, 2005

Further to the bylaws of the Canadian Kennel Club (CKC), which regulates the practices of its members, the Saluki Club of Canada (SCoC) members are expected to function within the framework provided by its guidelines for ethical conduct.

1. All Saluki owners should place the well being of a Saluki as a top priority. This includes ensuring sanitary warm housing, fresh food and water, abundant supervised free exercise, and a stimulating environment. A Saluki's health should never be compromised by breeding or competitive objectives.
2. Members should represent themselves truthfully.
3. Members should treat and represent other members with respect, positive regard, and generous spirit.
4. Using the CKC breed standard, breedings should be between two excellent specimens that more than exemplify breed type and conformation, movement, and temperament.
5. Salukis should be placed in homes that have been carefully assessed for overall suitability. Members should make every effort to determine that a potential owner is committed to satisfying the breed's unique requirements. It is the responsibility of both the owner of the stud dog and the brood bitch to place puppies in suitable homes. A Saluki must never be placed in a pet store.
6. It is recommended that members follow CKC rules for breeders' responsibilities including: following CKC breeding guidelines, using non-breeding contracts for animals that do not meet the breed standard, and providing written guarantees. All Salukis must be sold with CKC papers.
7. Prior to a mating, the parties should define their overall breeding programs, a breeding contract that includes fiscal obligations, and after-sale responsibilities to the animal, new owners, and each other.
8. A puppy sale contract should include the following: the buyer agrees to provide an excellent home, the breeder agrees to give support by way of advice and education when asked, the breeder agrees to take back the puppy should the new home not work out for any reason.
9. Members should encourage new Saluki owners to join the Saluki Club of Canada.
